Agenda

Mrs. Inman approved agenda with flexibility; seconded by Mr. Herald.

Minutes Approval

Minutes from August were presented to be approved.

Motion was made to approve by Mr. Webster; seconded by Mr. Williams.

Good News Report

- Five BCHS students were named AP Scholars (received 3 or higher on 3 or more AP Exams): John Courtney, Rachel McGrath, Atul Noor, Alex Porter, and Clarissa Walter.
- One student, Michael Lee was named an AP Scholar with Honors (with an average score of 3.25 on all AP Exams taken; 3 or higher on four or more taken).
- Construction update:
 - Meeting Rooms: the windows are in but need to be framed; trim needs to be added to the steps; the brass plaques are to be re-hung in the front hallway; some items are to be moved to the gym lobby; the display cases are estimated to arrive Friday; doors are supposed to be here on the 24th; and the logo goes on the front hallway wall.
 - There was a meeting today about furniture for the new Arts Center. Right now, we are on target for its opening in December. It is almost under roof; we are told it will go faster once that happens.
- Mr. Herald commented on our school streaming service (set up by A.D. Lance Melching). He was able to watch the last game at home on television.
- AP Classes: Student numbers are up in those classes: US History has two AP classes; English 4 did increase AP student numbers with the course changes last year.
- BCHS received a donation from a relative of Skylar Sears which enabled the football program to purchase football pants this season.

Budget Reports

Reports were distributed and discussion followed.

The Band's report from the Band Booster's budget activities were included from September 7.

Budget was discussed including COVID costs, District reimbursements (\$10 per child). Also asked for Loss revenue from sports--\$2500 maintenance packet (clean, sanitize, etc.) plus \$8000.

The District purchased two instructor positions, the Read 180 program, the Kagan Training for the faculty (in August), and will purchase Kagan-type items for classrooms. It also purchased a fourth guidance counselor.

Motion to approve the budget reports was made by Mr. Webster; seconded by Mrs. Inman.

New Business

- The BCHS Safety Plan was presented (sent electronically to Council members). This is not released to the public nor copies distributed due to security.
- The SBDM Budget Proposal (2020-21 and 2021-22 were compared) included gathered Student Fee monies. This is not the only money each Department receives (Free and Reduced—lunch, sports, trips, etc.)
- Mr. Howard made a motion to accept the SBDM Departmental Budget; it was seconded by Mr. Webster.
- This year, BCHS collected approximately \$50,000 in fee monies; BCHS has a larger Free and Reduced Lunch population than other high schools in the District which affects this collection.
- BCHS, as are other schools in the area, is experiencing student behavior issues. Tic Tok seems to be a contributing factor to these behavior issues. Steps have been taken to curtail this vandalism.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mrs. Inman; seconded by Mr. Herald.
