- Boys’ and Girls’ track teams had a great opening night at our new Track and Field facility. First track meet in 3 seasons.
- The BCHS Forensics team went to State this past weekend.
- The Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble had outstanding performances at their assessment: Symphonic Band received a distinguished rating and the Wind Ensemble, a Proficient rating.
- Juniors took the ACT test last week (March 7th). Mr. Herald said students worked hard.
- AP and enroll is anticipated up for next year.
- Prom tickets go on sale March 21.
- The Archery Team placed third Saturday, February 19th at Harrison County. According to AD Lance Melching, it was probably the team’s best finish in the three-year history of the program.

- There is a drive to encourage more students to take AP classes. This year, if an AP class Mr. Herald has been recruiting students to take AP classes.

- Per Mr. Herald: last year, 88% of our students planned to attend post-secondary institution.
