

The following advanced program options are available at Boone County High School:

Honors classes	AP Classes

School of Design	School of Innovation

Honors classes are offered for nearly every core academic course. Students may sign up for these classes if they're interested with no GPA or attendance requirements; however, previous test scores will be considered during the scheduling process for freshmen.

Upperclassmen students who wish to sign up for Honors Courses and who do not meet the following recommendations for will be strongly discouraged from signing up for the course:

- A minimum of a B in the pre-requisite course.
- Recommendation from a teacher within from the pre-requisite course.
- Must exhibit consistent attendance which does not result in disciplinary action (no disciplinary write-ups for tardiness or attendance).

After a student has been scheduled into an Honors Course, the no schedule change policy will be strictly adhered to.

- AP classes at Boone County High School are quite rigorous. Students wishing to enroll in an AP course must first demonstrate academic aptitude and preparation by
- Students must have earned an A or B in a prior course within that subject area.
- Students must exhibit consistent attendance which does not result in disciplinary action (no disciplinary write-ups for tardiness or attendance).
- Recommendation from a teacher within from the pre-requisite course.

Dual enrollment/early college classes are offered through Boone County High School (dual enrollment) and through the Boone County Schools District (early college). Students wishing to enroll in these programs must demonstrate the following:

- No freshmen or sophomore may take a dual enrollment or early college class.
- Students must have passed the End of Course Exams for each of the four subject areas tested: Algebra II, English II, US History, and Biology.
- Juniors who wish to take a dual enrollment class must take a class on the campus of BCHS.
- Students must meet the requirements set forth by the college in which they are wishing to attend, whether in the dual enrollment or early college program at Thomas More, Gateway, or Northern Kentucky University, with regards to

Students wishing to participate in the Boone County School District's School of Design or School of Innovation must first demonstrate the following:

- Students must have passed the End of Course Exams for each of the four subject areas tested: Algebra II, English II, US History, and Biology.
- Recommendation from a teacher within the Visual Arts department at BCHS (for the school of design) or from the applicable department (for the school of innovation).
- Students must exhibit consistent attendance which does not result in disciplinary action (no disciplinary write-ups for tardiness or attendance).
- Students must have a GPA of 2.8 or above.
