- Three Rebels were on the ballot for the Enquirer Athlete of the Week: Boys basketball-- Raymond Rogers; Girls Basketball—Tessa Gieske; Boys' Swimmer—Rob Winterman.
  - Tessa Gieske had 22 points in a 47-40 win over Notre Dame Academy Feb. 14.
  - Rob Winterman heads to State for his 11th and 12th events, putting him in a tie with Nick Berry for the school record.
  - He also will finish his career as the school's all-time leading point scorer.
  - Winterman's two State meet qualifications tied the school record for most total (12) and most individual (6). For his career, he has the most points in school history, 3 school individual and 3 relay records and was an all-region team/champion in the 50 freestyle.
  - Sean Courtney became the first Rebel to qualify for 5 different State Championship competitions.
  - Raymond Rogers had 24 points to lead the Rebels in a 62-20 Senior Night win over Dixie Heights on Feb. 16.
- Cheerleaders made it to finals, ranking 13.
- Adam Persons finishes his career as the 3rd member of the 1,000 Point Club.

- Maleah Hirn 1000 Point Club and becomes the first Rebel to graduate with an Associate's Degree.
- Cordell Vaske qualified for State Wrestling.
- Girls Bowling Team—Kara Strong and Taylor Evans finished first and second in the Regionals; The Team won Regionals.
