New Club Proposal

Assessment Results based upon On Demand Writing and ACT scores were also presented by Mr. Schlotman.

- BCHS increased our percentage in reading, had a huge increase in science students with disabilities in all areas.
- We also had the highest percentage (in comparison to the other Boone high schools) for our economically disadvantaged; and our science scores were higher than the State's.
- We are a three-star school and are no longer a TSI school.
- Our On Demand and Science scores were high.
- One low score was Transitional Indicators, a variety of career pathway programs (i.e. Dual enrollment, etc.)
- Our Graduation Indicator was high.
