Minutes Approval

Minutes from February were presented to be approved.

Budget Reports

Budget Reports were distributed and examined by Council.

Motion to approve was made by Ms. Patterson; seconded by Mr. Webster.

Good News Report

- Construction: the auditorium is being demolished, the Arts Center's north wall is going up (an aerial view was shared by Mr. Kohl). It is hoped that another pad will be poured this Friday. The football field turf is going down—end zone to end zone.
- At the February School Board meeting, a bond was approved, so one year from this spring break renovation on back building should begin. It will be worked on during the summer months.
- Though the initial plan was to do the entire back building at one time, plans were modified to begin with the second floor first. The following summer, they will do the first floor.
- Austin Dunkin received a prestigious honor: early acceptance into the NKU nursing program! Only 20 students are accepted each year.
- Girls Basketball gave a strong effort in their finals.
- In addition, the BCHS Boys Basketball vs Cooper High School (tonight) gave an extreme effort, losing in the last few minutes of that game.

New Business

The Tentative SBDM Budget for next year was received, based on \$140 per students. Our 2021-2022 projected student population is 1380--minus students attending Ignite. We won't know more until July 1st.

Credit for Positions

- SBDM pays the difference (\$23, 000) for one extra counselor; it works for BCHS, as we have such a diverse population.
- There are also purchases for summer hours to run the main office/phones.

- Our registrar works extra days after and before school ends and starts, which equals an extra 8 days.
- Website manager also receives a small stipend to keep the school's site updated.

Council members signed the Tentative Site-Based Budget Worksheet due to the District

Mr. Webster brought up the topic of SB128: Mr. Schlotman noted that it will be up to Districts. Funding is an issue that may prevent this bill from being implemented.

Allocation Worksheet

With students going to Ignite (an estimated 100 students), BCHS was cut two teachers.

- However, two teachers will not be returning in the fall: the Family and Consumer Science teacher and one from Social Studies.
- We must wait until after scheduling is finished and numbers are examined before knowing other faculty needs for next fall.
- Aerospace Pathway: Mr. Webster offered that he has experience in aerospace work. Eventually, BCHS will offer three classes in this area, the only school to do so in the District.
- Classified Section: There are no changes in allocations.

Council members signed these documents for the District.

Calendar Exchange Days

The BCHS faculty voted on and approved these exchanged days.

- Teachers report on August 4, 2021—schedule pickup day & half day of PD; exchanged for off day October 8th.
- Two Parent Conferences/Open House dates of September 22 and January 26 respectively, per semester (5 to 8 P.M.) were exchanged for being off President Day, Feb. 21
